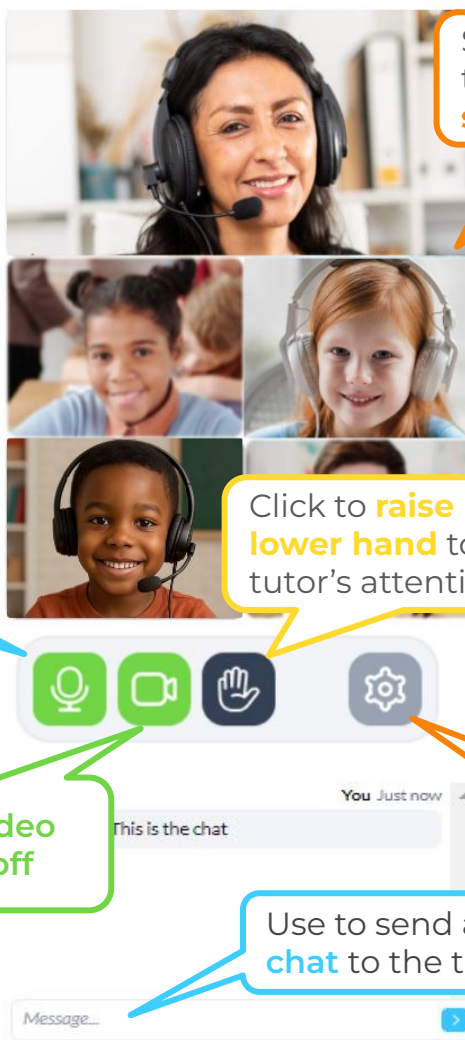




BOOKNOOK TUTORING Reading Classroom At a Glance

After logging in, students will enter the BookNook Reading Classroom. Here you will see the tutor and student video as well as additional controls on the left hand side with the BookNook lesson on the right side of the screen.



Students should see their tutor and **video screen** here.

Turns the **microphone on and off**

Click to **raise hand** and **lower hand** to get the tutor's attention.

Turns **video on and off**

Change the mic + camera **settings**.

Use to send a **text chat** to the tutor.

Green Means Go at BookNook! Use the green buttons to go to the game, join a session, enter your responses, and more!

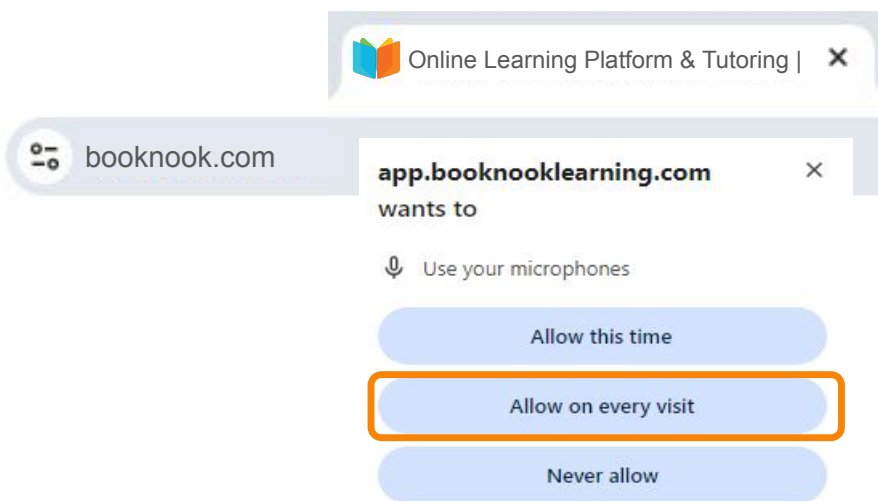

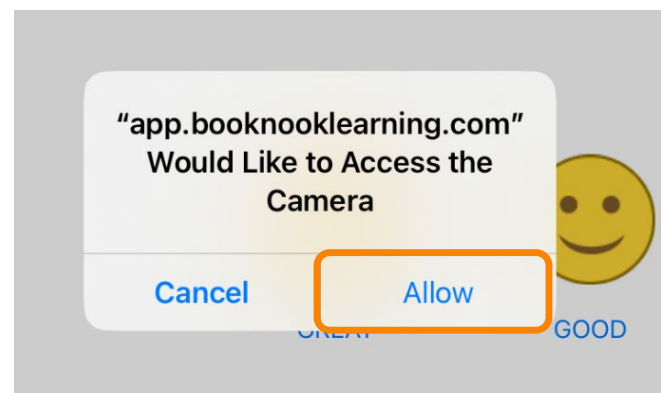
When you first join the Reading Classroom, please be sure students **turn on their video & audio** by clicking or tapping the icons so that they are green. Students will be prompted to **give video and audio permissions** after they turn on their video and audio.

On Chromebooks, laptops, or desktops, click “**Allow on every visit**” when prompted. On iPads click “**Allow.**”

Please note, students may need to select “allow” each time they log in.

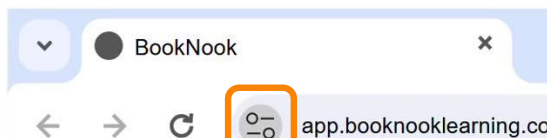


BOOKNOOK TUTORING Reading Classroom At a Glance

If **video or audio browser permissions are denied**, you will see a popup indicating that you will need to change permissions in the privacy settings of your browser. **If using the Chrome browser, follow the steps below** to turn permissions back on.

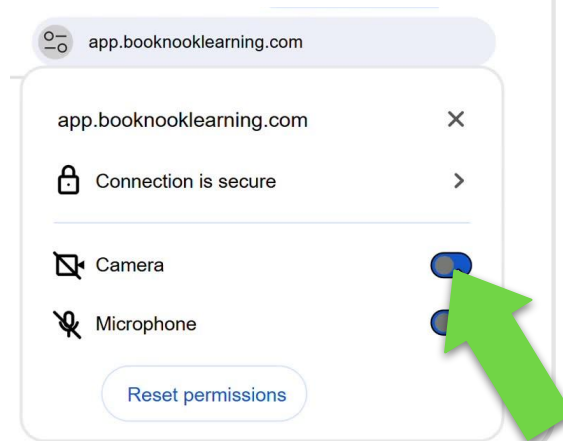

If video or audio permissions are denied and you see the pop up, you can fix this by clicking the Chrome **settings icon** next to the URL.



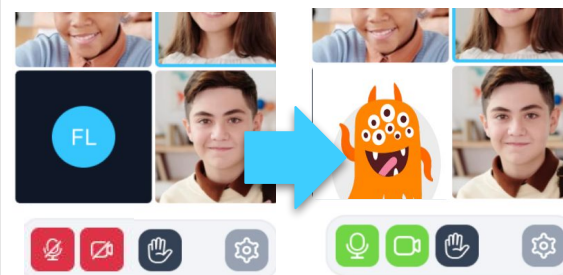
